REQUIREMENTS

The U.S. Department Bureau of Labor Statistics (2012-13) reports that graphic designers are usually required to have a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree. Some companies may request that the designer present their best work in a portfolio.

It is important that graphic designers have certain skills and abilities:

- **Artistic and design abilities:** Designers need to produce designs that are pleasing to their clients.
- **Knowledge of computer software programs:** The majority of designers use computers to create designs.
- **Communication skills:** Designers must effectively speak with clients to ensure a clear and precise understanding of their client's needs and desires.
- **The ability to collaborate with others:** Teamwork is essential because often specialized designers work together on a project. Their ability to work together will help produce successful products like websites, advertisements, videos, and a wide variety of other publications.
- **Imaginative and resourceful:** A graphic designer needs to be inventive when conveying ideas to the desires of their clients, so that their clients are able to decipher the message in the design.
- **Time management skills:** Graphic designers usually work on more than one project at a time. Each project has a specific time it needs to be completed. Therefore, a graphic designer needs to know how to manage time for each project.



Income

As of May 2010, the median earned income for graphic designers was \$43,500. Over \$76,910 was earned by the highest top ten percent of workers, and the lowest ten percent of workers earned less than \$26,200 (U.S. Department of Labor Statistics, 2012-13).

Lowest 10% Earned Less than	\$26,200





Projection

According to the U.S. Department of Labor Statistics, Employment Projections Program, in a ten year period, from 2010 to 2020, the occupational jobs for graphic designers that use computer design systems and related services will increase by 61 percent. Internet use and new technology continues to grow, and because of this increase, there will be a greater need for graphic designers. The projected employment for graphic designers from 2010 to 2020 is from 279,200 to 316,500 (2012-13).
